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## **SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY**

Stevens High School serves 550 students in grades 9- 12 from Claremont and Unity. The City of Claremont has approximately 13,000 residents and is situated on the western border of New Hampshire on the banks of the Connecticut River. Claremont is the largest community within a 30 mile radius and serves as a retail and professional hub for the region. Claremont is equally distanced, approximately 30 miles, from Dartmouth College and Keene State College. Both rural and suburban in nature, the city is a mixture of industrial and residential areas. The city is actively working towards economic revitalization.
