Our students are provided the opportunity to take career, vocational, and technical education classes at Sugar River Valley Regional Technical Center (SRVRTC) in both Claremont and Newport locations. These programs focus on the integration of cognitive, occupational and life skills to prepare students to function responsibly and productively in the workplace, as citizens, and as lifelong learners.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

- Stevens High School was accredited in March of 2017 by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges as well as approved by the State of New Hampshire Department of Education.
- A 4X4 block schedule consisting of four 65 minute blocks per day, a daily 90-minute flex/advisory time where students can seek support from teachers, participate in extracurricular clubs, or pursue enrichment opportunities.
- Stevens High School students are afforded the opportunity to earn college credits through a variety of partnerships with local colleges and through Running Start and AP courses.
- Stevens High School serves 533 students in grades 9- 12 from Claremont and Unity.
- The City of Claremont has approximately 13,000 residents.
- Claremont is situated on the western border of New Hampshire on the banks of the Connecticut River.
- Claremont is the largest community within a 30 mile radius and serves as a retail and professional hub for the region.
- Claremont is equally distanced, approximately 30 miles, from Dartmouth College and Keene State College.
- Both rural and suburban in nature, the city is a mixture of industrial and residential properties.
